

TRANSITIONS

Draft Transition strategy and Draft delivery plan produced for consultation.

Purpose to improve the smooth transition from children to adult's services where appropriate and from child hood to adulthood so that Children and Young people have better health outcomes, are engaged in their communities, can live as independently as possible, are engaged in learning / meaningful activity / employment and to ensure they have a voice.

HIGH NEEDS BLOCK

Government Funding to local government for children and young people with additional needs including but not exclusively SEND

Currently overspending by £2 million per year

Last year, Leicester City received circa £46 million per year but spent £48 million on support for pupils with additional and special educational needs – previously this shortfall has been covered by moving funds from the DSG or from reserves – the reserves will soon be exhausted

There is therefore a need to reduce spend by £2million – Leicester City will examine the efficiency and the effectiveness of its service and is currently undertaking a major consultation programme with its stakeholder as part of this process

Principle focus will be the needs of CYP whilst building sustainable high-quality services for the future

SSIF

Grant funded project work to improve outcomes for SEND pupils in years 6 and 10 in selected city schools

Application being put together to the Education Endowment Fund to build on the SSIF work





In May, OfSTED and CQC held a joint inspection of the local area. Leicester produced a Written Statement of Action showing how improvements would be made. We will be subject to regular monitoring by the Care Quality Commission and the DfE. View the plan on the Local Offer Website or PDF below.

Written Statement of Action accepted as fit for purpose by Ofsted.

SEND board reconfigured as SEND improvement Board with new membership that monitors the plan and ensure that the required actions are being implemented.

Working very closely with member and partners on the actions stated within the Written Statement of Action.

From November 2018 every child receiving a Statutory Assessment will receive an assessment from social care as part of the process.

Developing new parent and professional portals to enable direct access/ input to EHC plans.

SEND are Prepping for another inspection in 12-18 months.

Leicester City has a higher than national average % of those children in special school placements

Leicester City has a lower than national average children with EHCP in mainstream schools

We are working with schools to determine how we can better support children with EHC plans to be educated in mainstream settings Task and Finish Group

Considering ways to improve access to professional development for school staff in mainstream schools

Seeking ways to develop across school relationship between mainstream and special school to share and develop best practise Looking for ways to effectively share expertise Producing an action plan which will include pilot projects to commences in the spring/summer terms
