Eco-School Awards
Schools can register for Eco-Schools for free at www.eco-schools.org.uk/register

There are 3 levels of award: Bronze, Silver and Green Flag which were updated in September 2018.

At Bronze level your school has set up an Eco-committee, carried out a review, created an action plan for three topics and shared this with the whole school.

At Silver level your school has done the above plus involved the whole school and wider community and carried out three in-depth pieces of work on three of the ten topics. You have also identified where environmental issues are covered in the curriculum.

At Green Flag Award status, your school has done all of the above plus monitored and evaluated the in-depth project work for the same three of the ten topics and developed an Eco-Code which reflects the topics you have worked on.

Bronze and Silver are self-certified online. For Green Flag, schools submit evidence online and are visited by an external assessor at a mutually agreed time.

Citizens' Assembly for Schools on the Climate Emergency in Leicester

In February 2019, like many cities Leicester declared a climate emergency. The implication of declaring a climate emergency is that Leicester will need to work towards becoming carbon neutral as rapidly as possible i.e. its emissions of greenhouse gases must reach as close as possible to zero, with any remaining emissions that can't be avoided being offset in some way.

We are developing a plan of actions to address the emergency and are inviting school students to find out their views on what we should do.

Secondary schools are invited to attend with students from Years 9-10 on Wednesday 20 November from 9.30am to 2.30pm. The event will be a series of presentations, interactive sessions and opportunities for students to discuss and be formally consulted on proposed actions

In February 2019, like many cities Leicester declared a climate emergency. The implication of declaring a climate emergency is that Leicester will need to work towards becoming carbon neutral as rapidly as possible i.e. its emissions of greenhouse gases must reach as close as possible to zero, with any residual emissions that can't be avoided being offset in some way

- Students will develop a greater understanding of climate change and the implications for Leicester
- In the morning, city-wide carbon savings and actions will be consulted on and prioritised
- A collective vision will be created around the climate emergency and shared responsibility
- Solutions will be developed in the afternoon which the city will take forward in our action plan

For the first time, adults are invited to join Leicester's **#YouthStrike4Climate**. Meet at the Clock Tower at 12 noon on 20th September. There will be a march to Jubilee Square to listen to speakers.

This is an ideal time to talk to your class or school about why people are striking. In school you could:

- Present in class or assembly – using the PowerPoint which will be emailed about the strikes
- Support students to make their own 'in strike' during the day, so make banners and posters to use in the playground at lunchtime
- Put photos up on the school's website & social media accounts – Twitter/Facebook and tag us **@EcoSchoolLCC**
- Create actions that the students will do themselves
- Commit to actions in school **e.g. switching to renewable energy suppliers**
- Meet as an eco/environment team to look at what they are doing in school for the climate emergency with the senior teachers/head




